De facto, Germany has been a country of immigration since the 1960s. But hundreds of thousands of Polish Migrants came to live in the industrial Ruhr area prior to World War I as well. Following economists and scientists, politicians have realized a modern society with a deficient birthrate to be in need of immigrants. What can the media, what can journalists contribute, in order to enable migrants to feel at home in their receiving country? What can be missed, even ruined by journalists and media with regard to the integration of ethnic minorities? Scholars from Austria, Canada, France, Germany, Russia, Switzerland, The Netherlands, and the U.S. assemble at this conference, in order to exchange their findings and questions on the matter of media integration of migrants. Can European media learn from the experiences in the classic countries of immigration in North America?
